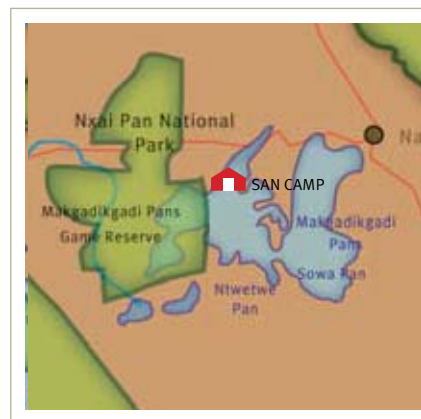

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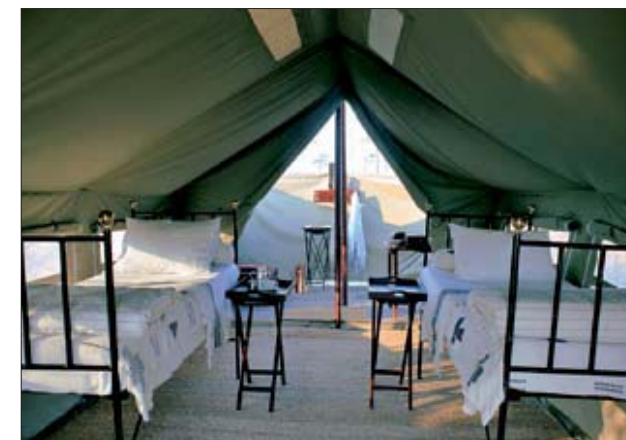


### Vintage Wilderness Camp

San Camp is situated deep in the Kalahari, right on the edge of the main Makgadikgadi saltpan. Here, khaki and white canvas blends into the salty expanse and the only colours are the blue of the sky, the white of the salt and the golden yellow of the grasslands. San Camp is a return to the true safari experience, with no running water or electricity. The camp's hub is a romantic white canvas pavilion, with a fluttering valance beneath its eaves. Two poles support the main chamber where everyone meets for meals at a long communal dining table. Interesting collections of bones, pottery, stone tools and beadwork fill the antique display cases; the spoils of many family safaris through the area.



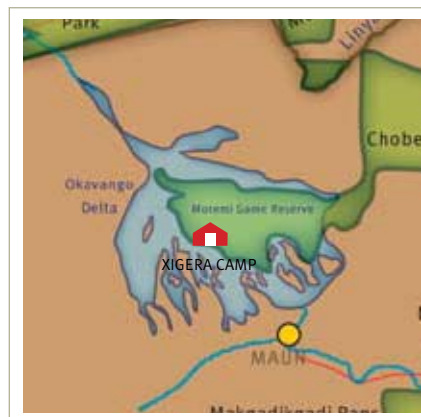
Six pale khaki canvas tents with en-suite bucket showers and flushing toilets create an oasis of civilisation in what can be the harshest of stark environments. Activities are aimed at guests gaining an astonishing holistic understanding of the Kalahari and all its inhabitants. The Kalahari Desert is its own universe, the only place where guests are virtually guaranteed to see the rare and elusive brown hyena and be able to walk through the Kalahari with a gang of habituated, yet wild meerkats! The guides at San Camp team up with a small group of Zu/'hoasi Bushmen to guide guests on morning walks and game drives. During the dry winter months, venture into the centre of the Makgadikgadi on quad bikes, and explore remote archaeological sites.



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### Classic Wilderness Camp

A stay at Jack's Camp is a true encounter with the vastness and isolation of the Kalahari and Makgadikgadi pans. Originally established by the late Jack Bousfield in the early 1960s, it has continued to be developed by his son, Ralph and his partner, Catherine Raphaely. The camp creates an oasis of civilisation in what is considered to be one of the harshest of environments on Earth. Jack's is furnished in a traditional East African 1940s safari style – authentic, comfortable and elegant. Ten very private, classically styled and spacious tents are built on decks and set in a palm grove. Each tent has a beautiful en-suite bathroom with indoor and outdoor showers, flush toilets, hot and cold running water. A safari at Jack's is the complete desert experience, focusing on desert-



adapted wildlife as well as the geology, archaeology and anthropology of the Kalahari and Makgadikgadi. Quad bike excursions onto the vast salt pans (during the dry season), walking with San (Bushman) trackers, an interactive encounter with an habituated meerkat family and a rare opportunity to see one of Africa's most elusive carnivores, the brown hyena, are just some of the activities to be enjoyed while at this unique camp. Guests visiting Jack's during the wet season can witness the desert transformed as clouds of flamingo and other migratory birds descend from the heavens and the incredible zebra and wildebeest migration moves through the area. For several months the desert is teeming with game and predators.
