

“THE WARM HEART OF AFRICA ”



Highlights:

Our Safari takes us to the Zambezi Valley and the Lower Zambezi National park where we will stay in a riverside lodge with a wide range of superb safari activities. This remote area opposite Zimbabwe's world renowned Mana Pools, has fantastic wildlife both on land and in the river. You can canoe on the river; take leisurely motorboat rides possibly with a fishing rod, in search of the ferocious tiger fish that inhabit the river. Game drives and guided game walks are also a specialty.

The next stage of our trip to the warm heart of Africa is a superb 4x4 safari exploring the game rich central section of Zambia's superb South Luangwa National Park and the remote and undeveloped Southern region of the park where other vehicles are rarely encountered.

South Luangwa National Park is over 9000 square kilometers and is located along the Luangwa River in the East of Zambia. The beautiful river acts as a magnet for game and the density and variety to be found is impressive. Over time, the river's course has carved a multitude of channels, that, in winter, form lagoons and oxbow lakes, which are the focus of attention for the fascinating mammals and birdlife of South Luangwa. South Luangwa has a very large population of lions and is also one of the best places to see leopard in Africa with regular sightings being made on night drives along with other smaller cats and nocturnal

hunters. Elephants and giraffe are plentiful and countless hippos and crocodiles lurk in the cool waters of the river.

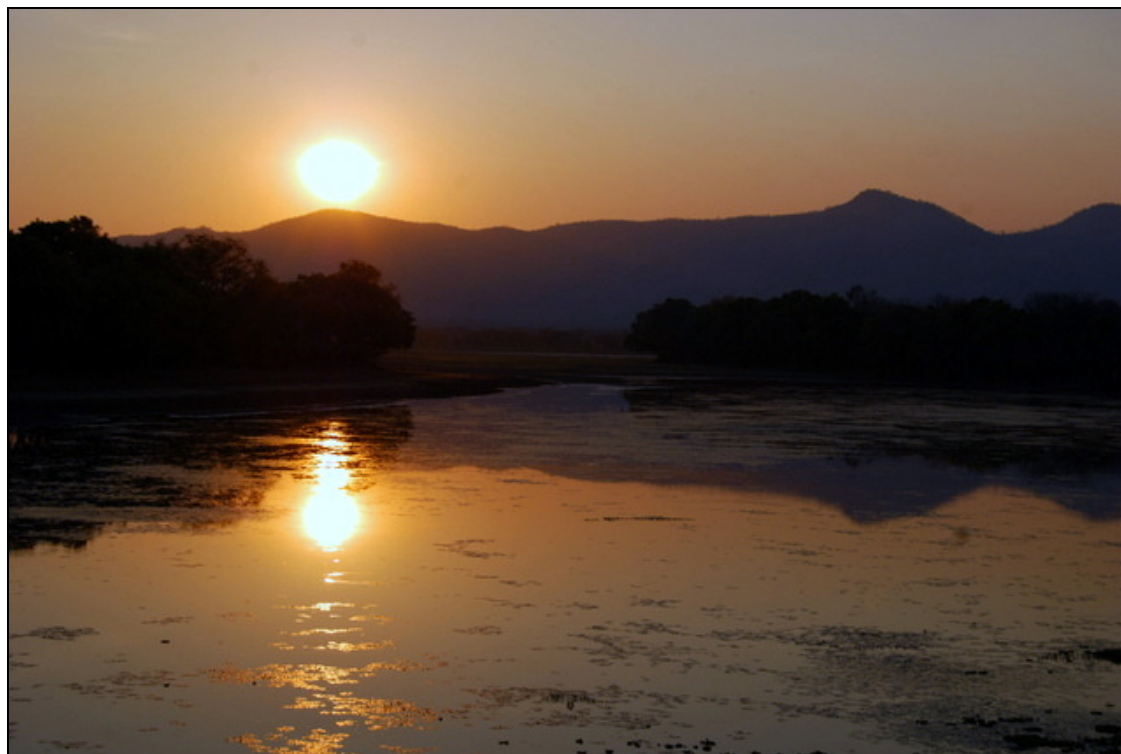
The accommodation is a mixture of high quality mid sized safari lodges and wonderful little bush camps where both the quality of the camps and the quality of the game viewing are not compromised.

The whole area is very scenic, much of it set against a backdrop of the river itself and its many tributaries and lagoons as well as the the Muchinga Escarpment and the Chindeni Hills.

Your safari here will include a full range of game activities including day and night drives in open, specially adapted 4x4 safari vehicles. The highlight for many will be the walking safaris for which Zambia is rightly famous, which are conducted by a highly trained English speaking guide and an armed National Parks scout.

The final part of our safari takes us to Victoria Falls, one of the seven wonders of the world where in addition to guided tours of the falls a whole range of other fascinating activities are possible

This safari is offered in conjunction with our highly respected Zambian associates, the Bushcamp Company.



Day 1

You will arrive on your International flight at Lusaka International Airport where our representative will meet you and assist you onto your light aircraft flight to the Lower Zambezi National Park. You will be met off the flight and transferred to Chongwe River Camp where you will be staying for the next four nights on an all inclusive basis.

Chongwe River Camp is situated on the confluence of the Chongwe and Zambezi Rivers,

directly opposite Mana Pools. The Chongwe River is the boundary of the Lower Zambezi National Park. The camp has a wonderful view of not only the confluence of the two rivers but also the mountains of the impressive Zambezi escarpment. Situated under a canopy of Albida thorns and surrounded by cool lawns, there are eight chalets large, well appointed safari tents under thatch, with luxury en-suite open air bathrooms. The bathrooms are an experience on their own. All fittings are made from natural materials found near the lodge.

There is a swimming pool, large shady gardens and a comfortable lounge bar area. A variety of land and water based activities are on offer including game drives (day and night) and walks, canoeing, motor boating and fishing.

A normal day consists of an early morning activity followed by a hearty brunch and siesta time through the heat of the day, then afternoon tea and cakes followed by another activity and evening dinner.

Lion, leopard, buffalo, hippo, and elephant are frequently seen on activities. In between big game sightings at the camp, one can expect to see plenty other game such as impala, warthog, waterbuck, kudu, bushbuck, hyena and baboon. The area also has rarer species like honey badger, porcupine, aardvark, klipspringer and pangolin.

One of the most appealing things about Chongwe River Camp is the scenery from camp and surrounding the area – changing from riparian woodland to open plains and dense forest all with the backdrop of mountains and the mighty Zambezi make this area simply beautiful to immerse yourself into, away from the modern, western world.

Day 5

You will transfer to the airstrip for your flight to Mfuwe via Lusaka. You will be met at the airport by our representative and transferred to the National Park through the main gate and over the Luangwa River Bridge. Your first night will be spent at the excellent and recently refurbished Mfuwe Lodge one of only three lodges inside the National Park. Your accommodation is in a chalet overlooking a lagoon at which wildlife is regularly spotted as well as many birds including fish eagles, water fowl and kingfishers. The Lodge has a comfortable bar and dining area as well as a swimming pool, periodically elephants have been known to visit the bar here.

In the afternoon you will be able to take your first game drive in the park which usually takes the form of a late afternoon drive followed by a stop for sundowners in a scenic spot where you can watch the fiery African setting over the bush, before continuing on with a night drive.

Depending on sightings we usually return to the camp by about 2000 hours for dinner.

Your stay here is on a full board basis and includes all your game activities, park fees and laundry. Drinks from the bar are not included.

Day 6 & 7

You will have a two full days at Mfuwe Lodge during which you will be able to explore the game rich central region of South Luangwa National Park on twice daily game drives. The area has many elephant, huge herds of buffalo and plentiful predators, so the game drives will inevitably be rewarding and present many excellent photo opportunities.

Day 8 & 9

Today you will have an early morning departure heading south through the National Park to Chindeni Bush Camp where you will be staying for two nights. This transfer like all the others on this safari is a game drive transfer, along park roads, at a slow game drive speed stopping to observe the wildlife that will be encountered on route. The transfer takes three to four hours depending on sightings and you should arrive in time for brunch.

Chindeni is a magical bush camp surrounded by majestic hills and shaded by ancient ebony trees, the camp is nestled in the apex of an ox bow lagoon where wildlife comes to drink and feed.

The usual routine at Chindeni is to take an early morning guided bush walk before the sun gets too hot followed by breakfast. These walks are conducted at a leisurely pace and will suit most levels of physical fitness; we stop regularly along the route to look at tracks and spoor as well as stopping to observe any wildlife and birds we encounter on our walk. Guided game walks are a great opportunity to learn more about the bush and the smaller creatures that live here as well as the local flora and its many traditional uses. Few experiences can compare with the exhilaration of tracking big game on foot in the African Bush.

On return to camp you will enjoy brunch or breakfast and then have the middle of the day for a siesta or to sit on your private deck or on the camp viewing deck watching the wildlife coming down to the river or grazing on the river bank.



In the late afternoon we will set off on a game drive stopping just before sunset to enjoy a sun downer and to watch the setting sun before continuing on a night drive with a powerful searchlight. At night we have a chance to see nocturnal animals such as leopard, hyena, serval, genet, civet cats and porcupine, animals which are not usually spotted during the day.

Day 10 to 12

We have a short game drive transfer to our next Bushcamp which is Chamilandu Bushcamp where we will spend the next three nights on a fully inclusive basis.

Chamilandu's three exquisite tree-houses perch right on the edge of the Luangwa River. Each has its own raised veranda to loll on during the heat of the day, and an open-fronted en-suite bathroom with the same magnificent views over the tranquil waters. Two of the tree-houses have twin beds (queen-sized beds) and one has a double (king-sized bed). With capacity for just six guests, this is the perfect camp for small groups.

Walking safaris and game drives around Chamilandu explore the impressive range of habitats in the area. With no fewer than seven oxbow lagoons behind camp, there are always thirsty animals around seeking refreshment. Our hide looks out over one of these lagoons and is the perfect place to take lunch, tea or to while away an afternoon in a hammock to the soundtrack of bathing elephant.

Day 13 & 14

Today we depart early for our return to Mfuwe. Once again this is a slow game drive transfer through the park stopping when appropriate to view any interesting sightings. If time permits we will stop for lunch at Mfuwe Lodge before continuing on to the airport for our scheduled light aircraft flight to Livingstone.

On arrival at Livingstone you will be met and transferred to Waterberry Lodge where you will be staying for the next two nights on an all inclusive basis, including certain activities.

Africa's wildlife is free ranging and moves according to seasonal availability of food and water therefore no sighting is guaranteed. The following species can be found in the areas visited on this safari and guests can expect to see many of them.

Elephant, Giraffe, Lion, Leopard, Wild Dog, Spotted Hyena, Jackal, African Wildcat, Serval, Civet, Chacma Baboon, Vervet Monkey, bush baby, Lesser Spotted Genet, Greater Spotted Genet, Mongoose, Porcupine, Aardvark, Pangolin, Cape Buffalo, Zebra, Wildebeest, Sable Antelope. Roan Antelope, Puku, Impala, Bushbuck, Eland, Duiker, Tsessebe, Waterbuck, Steenbok, Red Lechwe, Greater Kudu. Hippopotamus, Crocodile, Monitor Lizard, Scrub Hare, Bat Eared Fox. Also many bird and reptile species.

When to go:

This Safari is available from 1 st June to 31 st October and offers an excellent value high quality safari during the peak season dry winter and early summer months.

Who should go:

Perfect for a first safari or first time visitors to Zambia, a wonderful excellent value trip for that once in a lifetime experience or special occasion. Children under 12 not permitted.
